End of Year Financial Updates

Medicare Reimbursement

Don't forget to submit your Forms!

Remember to fill out the form attached at the end of this newsletter and submit it to the District Office for Medicare reimbursement for 2022.

In addition to the standard Medicare Part "B" Premium, Medicare enrollees with a higher modified adjusted gross income (MAGI) pay an additional income-related monthly adjustment (IRMAA), a medicare premium amount adjusted for their income, for Part "B" Medicare coverage. This will be reflected on your SA-1099 Social Security Benefit Statement.

Be sure to review your SA- 1099 and note the total amount of Medicare Part B premiums deducted from your total benefits. This can be found in the section, "Description of Amount in Box 3". Subtract the amount already reimbursed quarterly by the District.

If Social Security has deducted more than that amount, you are entitled to a reimbursement of the difference by the District.

Send a letter requesting reimbursement.

- A copy of your documentation from the Social Security Administration detailing your monthly premium for Medicare Part "B" for <u>2022</u>.

Please be advised, for the calendar year 2023 the district will **only** accept the documentation received by the recipient during the last quarter of 2022 detailing the monthly Social Security payment to be received and the Medicare Part B premium. Please be sure to forward a copy of this document to me as soon as it is received.

Please be advised, for auditing purposes, redacted Bank Statements are <u>no longer</u> acceptable proof justifying the amount to be reimbursed for Medicare Part B.
